What to Bring and Don't

Keep in mind that leaving the property is discouraged as a safety measure. We ask that you bring everything you need with you and submit to the moment. Ration your cigarettes and ice carefully, there is no convenience store nearby to run to.

Category #1: Not Optional

- Shelter from the weather:
 - Tent or
 - Hammock + tarp or
 - Vehicle suitable for sleeping in
 - Suitable Blankets / sleeping bag
- Food and Water for duration of event. DRINK WATER
- A way to prepare / cook food
- Prescription Medications
- Ticket + ID
- Positive Attitude and Open Mind

Category# 2: Need it

- Clothing with layer options
- Headlamp or flashlight
- Boots / good shoes
- Cooler for food + beverages
- Enough ice for the weekend

Category #3: Good to have

- Camp Chair
- Lantern / area light for camp
- Backup battery for charging devices
- Rain gear
- Towel(s) for shower/drying gear if raining
- Camp decor. Express Yourself!
- Booze and extras to share!

Category #4: We'd rather you didn't

- Pop-up canopies for personal camps. Square footage in the campgrounds is limited, so if you can live without your canopy, leave it at home.
- Personal speakers. A small bluetooth speaker for your camp is okay if you must, but please don't rattle your neighbors. There's like 10,000+ watts of sound going for 15 hours a day on the stages...
- Glass bottles. We don't want broken glass. We'll ask you to throw it away if we see it.

Category #5: Absolutely not, we'll ask you to leave

- Fireworks, laser pointers, air horns, or anything else that would draw additional unwanted attention to the Gathering.
- Pets, with the exception of service animals. You do not want a pet lost in the woods in rural Alabama.
- Weapons
- Illegal substances
- Racism, Sexism, Classism, Homophobia, Transphobia, Xenophobia, Harassment, Violence, Hate. You'll be made to leave quicker than you can say Yeehaw Motherfucker. Don't test us.
